

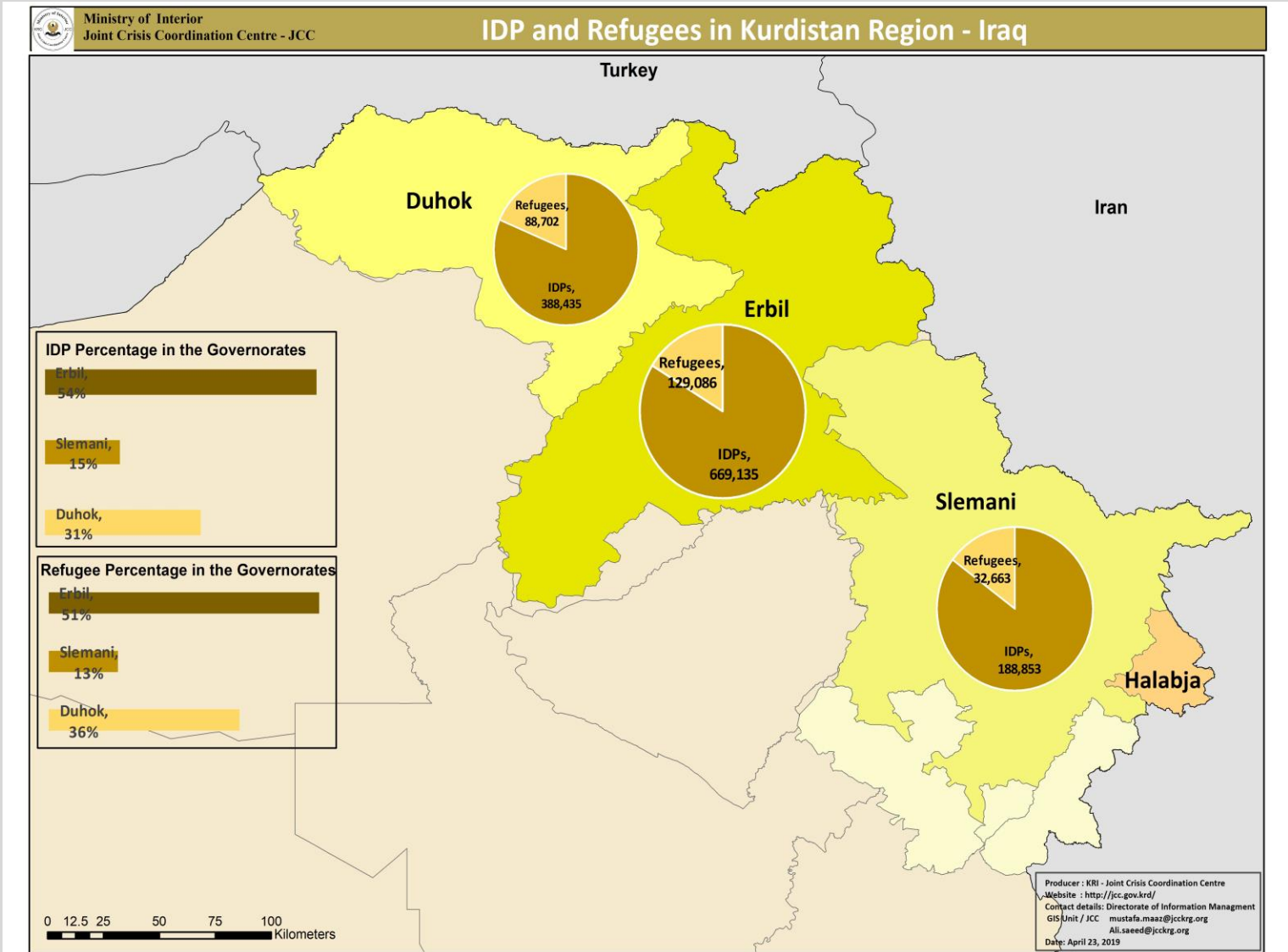

Currently the KRG is the host of 250,451 Syrian, 9,150 Turkish, 13,182 Iranian, and 760 Palestinian refugees. Contrary to popular perception, the majority of IDPs and refugees live with the host communities in the Region, while only 37 percent living in the 38 camps. 50 percent of the total displaced population live in Erbil, 31 percent in Duhok, and 19 percent in Slemani.

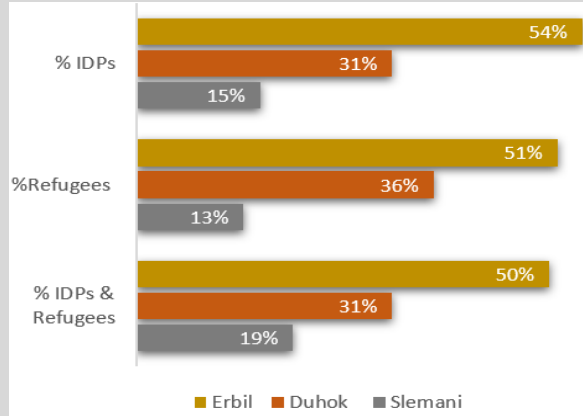

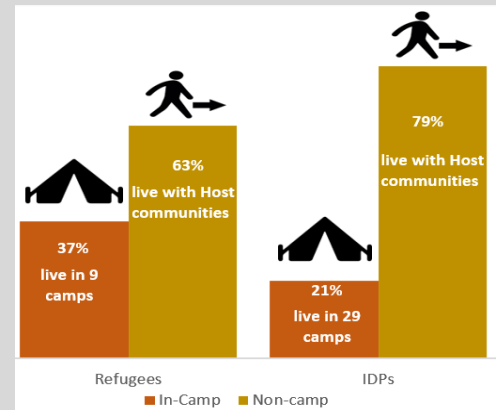

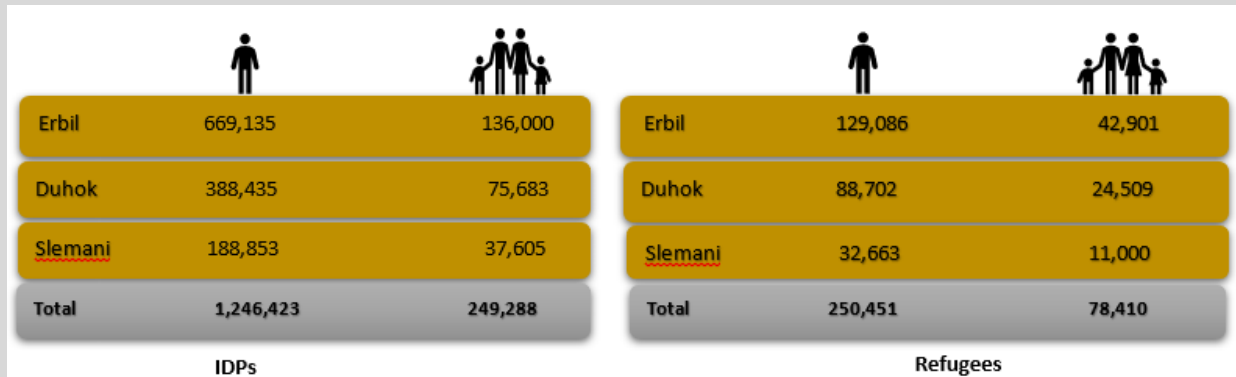
% of IDPs and Refugees in Each Governorate



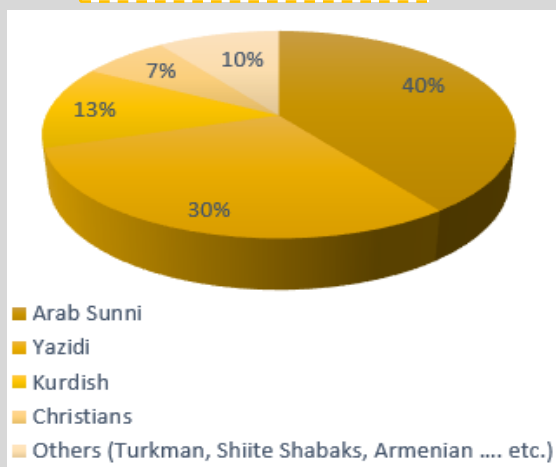
Location of IDPs and Refugees



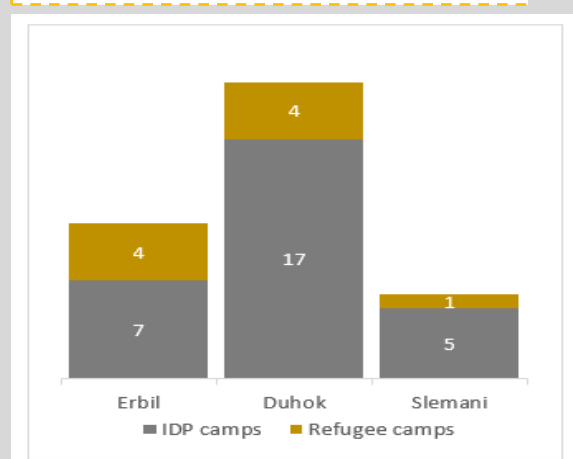
Geographical Distribution of IDPs and Syrian Refugees

Number of Camps in KRI





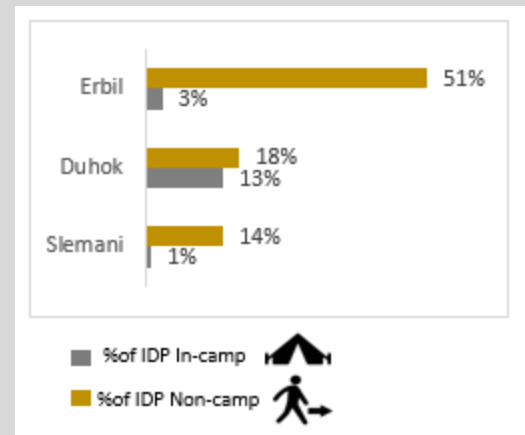
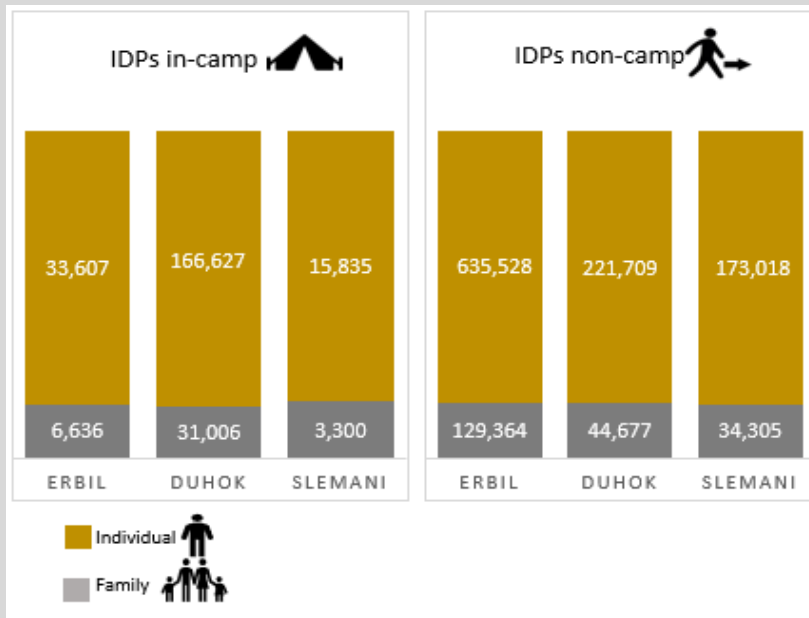

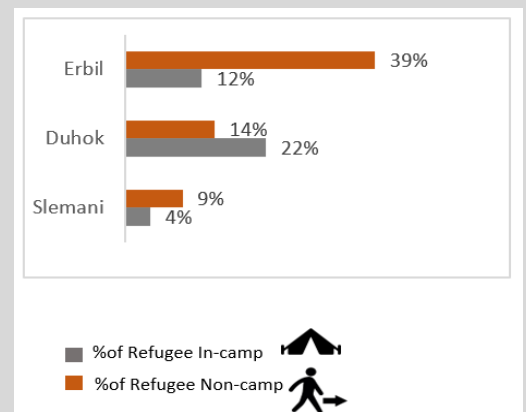
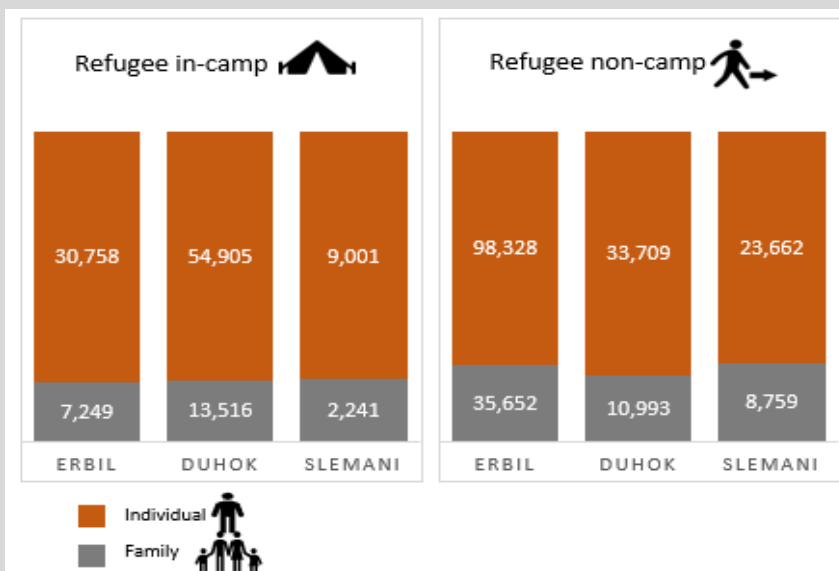


The Kurdistan Regional Government has received and helped the vulnerable people without any discrimination and prejudice, and thus, the displaced people in Kurdistan are from various sects, ethnicities, religious backgrounds such as 40 percent are Sunni Arabs, 30 percent are Yezidis, 13 percent are Kurds, 7 percent are Christians, and 10 percent are Shia, Turkmen, or Shabaks and others.

Total Number of Syrain Refugees (In-camp and Non-camp)



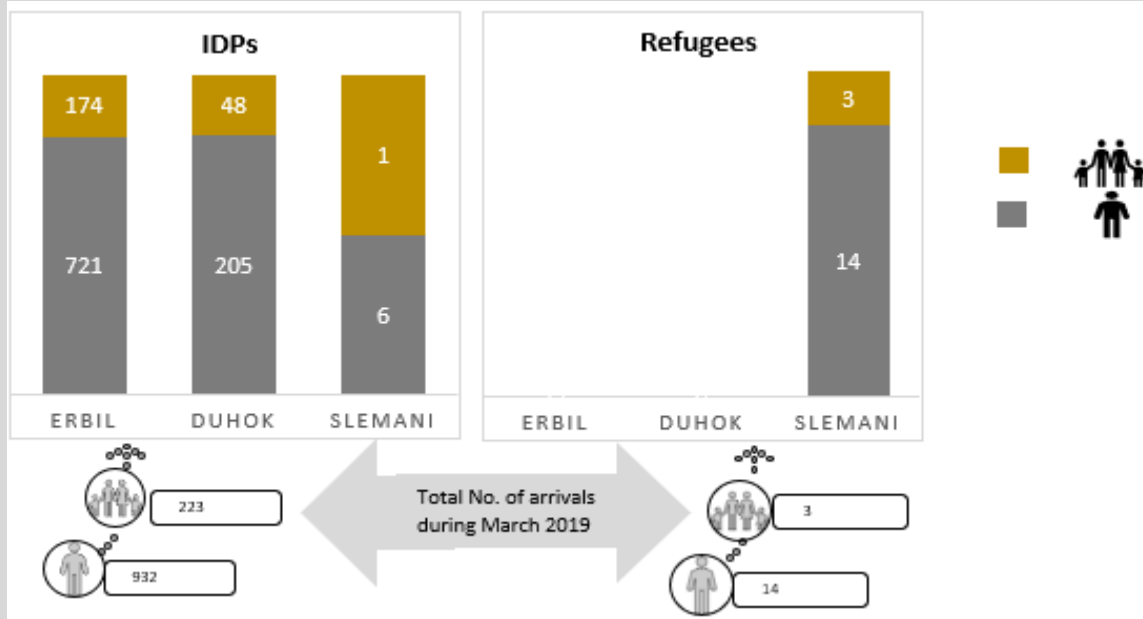

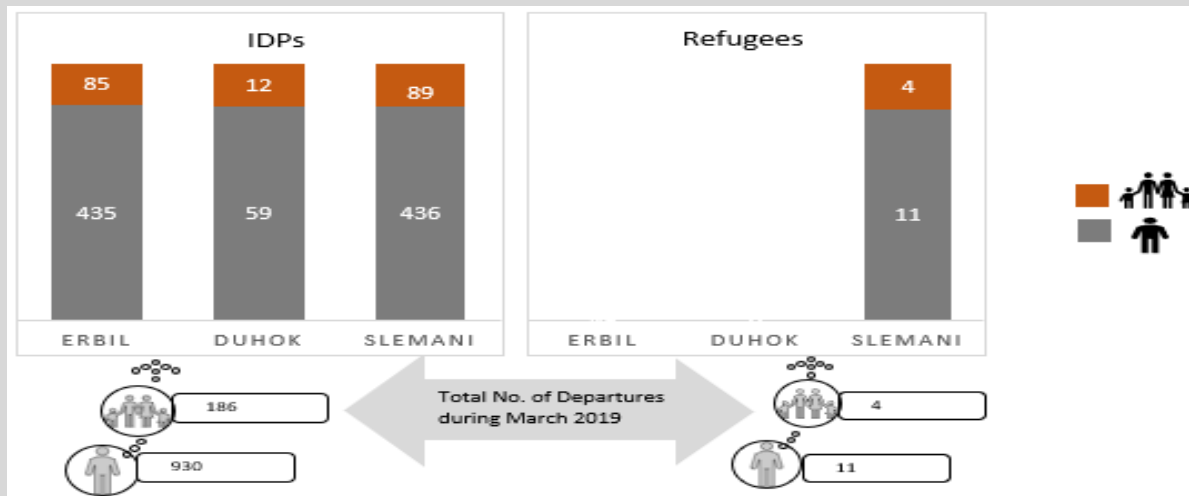

New and Second Displacement to KRI



IDPs and Refugees left KRI; Returned or Migrated



As highlighted, the displacement continued throughout the 2019 and still people are compelled to leave their areas for security, livelihood, and economic reasons and come to the Kurdistan, in March 2019, as many as 946 IDPs and refugees entered the Kurdistan Region. Nearly 932 of them were IDPs and 14 were Syrian refugees. Additionally, up to 941 internally displaced persons and Syrian refugees have left the Kurdistan Region in March 2019; either returning to their places of origin in the liberated areas or migrated to Europe and other countries legally and through other means.

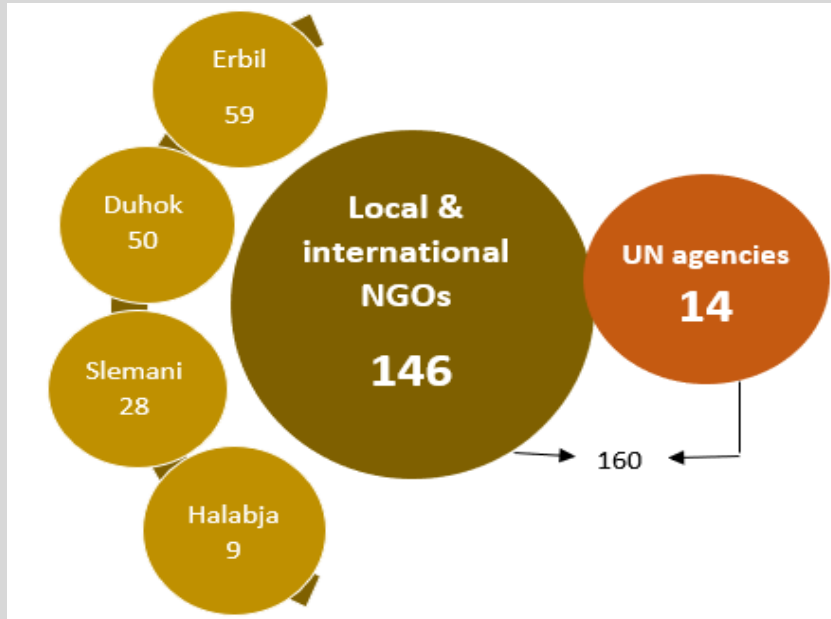
